
Hope and Redemption in Baseball's Longest Game



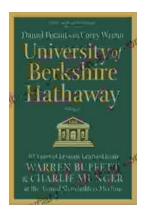
