

The Fighter Pilot Hero of World War II: The Incredible Story of Bob Hoover



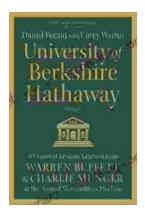
