 Broad depressed head; 8 unconnected dorsal fin spines; dark lateral stripe from snout through eye to tail  
 Inshore near underwater structures; offshore near drifting or stationary objects

**Florida pompano**  
*Trachinotus carolinus*  
 1-1.5 feet  
 Small mouth; body flattened side-to-side; smooth upper-body profile (no angle at 2nd dorsal fin insertion)  
 Off beaches; in coastal bays, estuaries, near bridges and piers

**Greater amberjack**  
*Seriola dumerilii*  
 5-4 feet  
 Streamlined body; dark band from snout through eye to dorsal fin; amber stripe down length of side  
 Upper water column near artificial reefs, floating debris and oil rigs

**Atlantic bumper**  
*Chloroscombrus chrysurus*  
 5-8 inches  
 Body flattened side-to-side; strongly curved belly profile; dark spot on gill cover; dark saddle on top of tail base  
 Nearshore over soft bottom; inshore in high-salinity bays

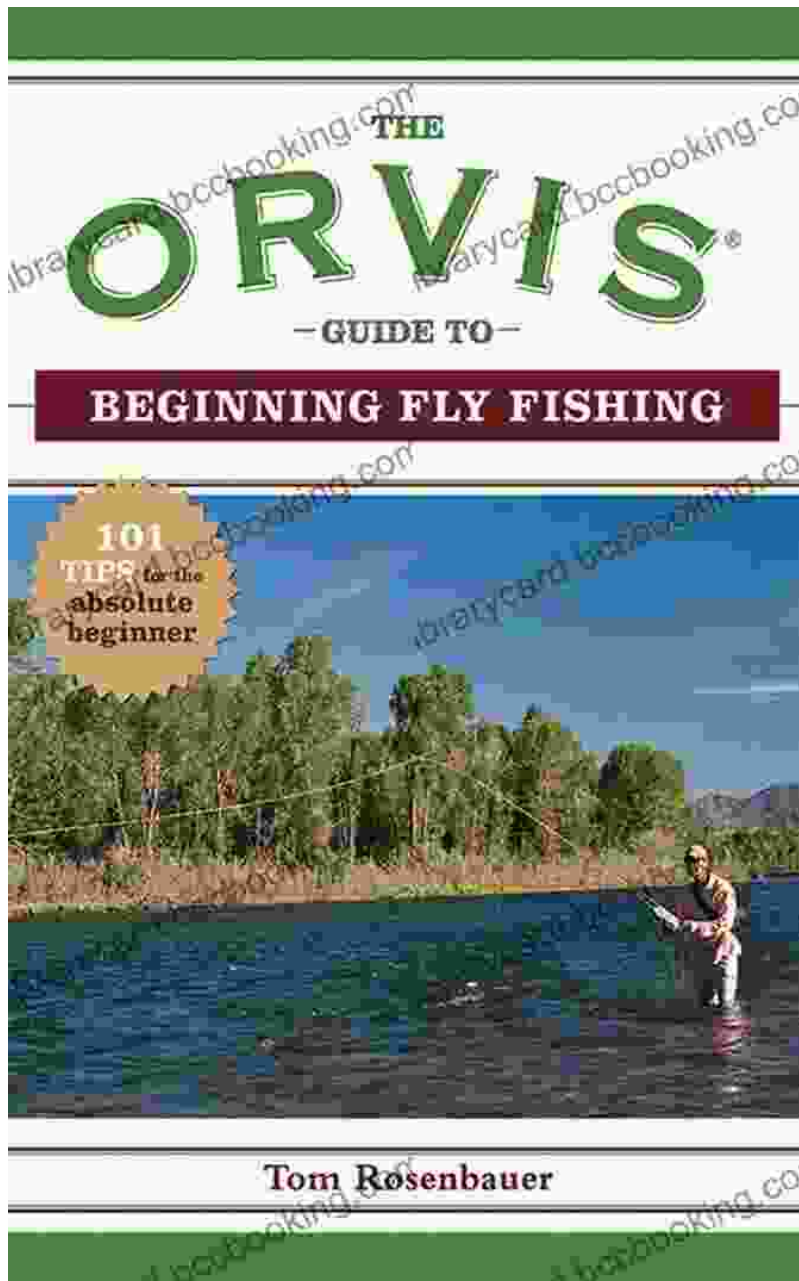
**Blue runner**  
*Ceanox cyanoideus*  
 1-2 feet  
 Black spot on gill cover; black tips on tail; enlarged hard scales in a line out to tail  
 Coastal bays and sounds; off beaches; spawns offshore

**Creville jack**  
*Ceanox bifasciatus*  
 2-3 feet  
 High forehead profile; black spots at pectoral fin base and on gill cover; enlarged hard scales in a line out to tail  
 Shoreline to open water; into estuaries and riverine areas

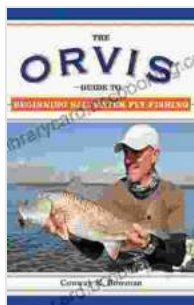

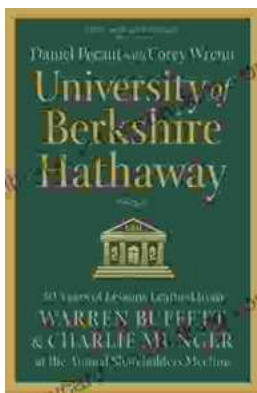
